

More Lore: Marimekko



The Marimekko clothing and textile design company, based in Helsinki, was created by Armi Ratia and her husband, Viljo. The first store opened in 1952. But these designs really came to everyone's attention when Jackie Kennedy bought seven Marimekko dresses and appeared on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* in December 1960 wearing a red sleeveless number. "Marimekko" comes from an anagram of Mari, from Armi, and *mekko*, "dress" in Finnish. The bold designs and bright colors of Marimekko were from the very first an attempt to bring life and light into people's lives during the long Finnish winters. The company's products are sold through more than 140 stores in some 40 countries around the world, primarily in northern Europe, North America, and the Asia-Pacific region.—Adapted from an unsigned article in *American Lifestyle*, Issue 76.

No dumping of leftover concrete on Finn Camp property. There is a concrete recycling plant on 12 Mile Rd. east of Beck Rd.
